Here are some good tips that will help you do a masterful job.

- Park the car out of direct sunshine. This prevents premature drying. Not a bad idea to also check the weather forecast. You probably don't want to wash a car right before it rains.
- Gather everything you're going to need. It's a good idea to keep the cleaning process going smoothly once you start.
 - · Bucket with hot water
 - Soap
 - Hose
 - Rags or chamois for drying
- Mix soap in with the hot water.
- Close all doors and roof of the car and wet the car down with a hose. Get off any loose dirt. Dirt left on the body work could act like sandpaper and scratch the paintwork. Don't use a strong jet. You can also flip out the windshield wipers.
- Using a mitt or sponge, scrub that car with soapy water. Make sure you keep wringing out the sponge or cloth so that there is no damaging grit on it.
- Clean the under body and wheels last. There will be more dirt there and you don't want to transfer that abrasive dirt to the upper paint.
- Hose off the car. Then the use the chamois or drying rag to prevent drips.
- Ensure that you get direction from your parents every step of the way. They may have some great tips.
