First, we need to get anything that's fallen cleaned up. This may include leaves and branches from off the lawn and the flowerbeds.

- Look at the trees. Knowing that soon you may have ice and snow on some of those branches, it's a good idea to trim back any branches that look like they might cause trouble throughout the winter.
- Drain and store your water hoses. A hose left attached to a faucet will probably blow the pipe as the water in the hose turns to ice and expands.
- Aerate the ground by breaking up the dirt. This way water can get to the roots of plants and not just pool on the surface throughout the winter.
- Clean tools and store them.



There are, of course, several other things you can do specific to your region. Work with your parents to get the garden winterized.
