- With your parent's guidance, rework your clothes, and decide what should be on hangers and what should be in drawers.
- Neatly hang your clothes so that your closet looks first rate.

- Not everything should go on a hanger. Some things are better off in a drawer. However, some clothes that you could put in a drawer crease so easily that you'll want them on a hanger because no one wants to iron clothes every time they want to wear something.
- A hanger is pretty much a triangle shape. so the top of the triangle is super good at hanging jackets, dresses, and shirts. Now you'll want to do up the top button of shirts and jackets if they have them or the item may slip off. A hack to help is to loop a rubber band along the tips of the triangle. This gives better friction and stops slipping.
- The bottom of that hanger is great for folding a pair of trousers over and you can still use the top for a jacket or shirt. Make sure you place trousers on the bar without creases, otherwise they'll look bad when you decide to wear them.
- Some hangers have clips on them. These are usually associated with ladies' clothes and are great to clip the top of a garment so that it hangs without creasing. This same style can also be used for trousers and shirts so it isn't just for the ladies.
- If you are running out of space on the closet rod

where you hang the hangers, you can always hang some hangers on the horizontal bar of another hanger.

Okay, with these few tips, you can have your clothing storage looking first rate, just like mine.
