EARN THIS NUGGET

- Have a family member put a collection of coins in a non-see-through bag and pull out a coin one at a time. You need to be able to say what the coin is called and how much it is worth. When you can do it for every coin right away for two days in a row, you'll have your Nugget.
- To make it easier, start off with only a penny and a dime in the bag. Once the Trekker has mastered that, start adding additional coins, one at a time.

You know that different coins are worth different amounts of money, and it's not necessarily the bigger they are the more they are worth. So what we are going to do is learn the different amounts.

- You have a penny, that's worth...well a penny or one cent.
- You have a nickel, and that's worth five cents. or five pennies.
- Then there is the dime which is worth ten cents, or two nickels, or ten pennies.
- And finally the quarter which is worth twenty-five cents.

Now being able to add the amounts of

the coins is going to be super important for you to be able to do. But first of all, you'll need to know the coins instantly and what they are worth.
