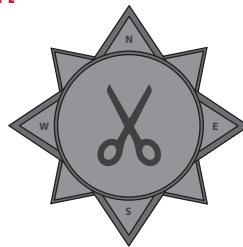


## MAKE A BIRD FEEDER

### EARN THIS NUGGET

Build a bird feeder that you are proud of and hang it in your garden or a garden nearby.

- A bird feeder must have a container, or hopper, to hold the seed...pretty obvious, huh?
- It must have a top to it to keep the seed dry.
- The container needs a tray the seed can fall into so the birds can get to it, but it won't fall out onto the ground.
- It must have an edge or a perch so the birds can stand on it and eat the seeds.
- You must be able to hang it.  
And that's about it.

Now go do some research. Go online or perhaps go to stores and see what is for sale. Then sketch out concepts. Look at your available tools and materials, then make it happen.
