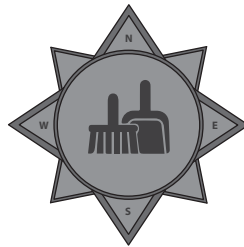


PREPARE CLOTHES FOR WASHING

So the first thing we need to do to sort clothes is separating the whites from the coloreds. You see whites are typically cleaned at a higher temperature. If you have colored clothes in that batch, the colors can run and you can get some very undesirable results. Unless you are my sister and then you luck out.

Another important thing to do as you sort clothes is check pockets. You'd be surprised about the things that get left in pockets: toys, cell phones, money, wallets, the cat, you name it. It can happen. So checking clothes before they go in is a must.
