So, here is a simple summary of the different values:

I=1 X=10 C=100 M=1,000

V=5 L=50 D=500

Now where it gets a little weird for us is when the Romans put a number to the right of another number, you add it, when you put it to the left. You subtract it:

III=3 IV=4 VIII=8 XXX=30 LXX=70

V=5 VI=6 IX=9 XL=40 LXXIV=74

And that's how those crazy Romans wrote number values.

It may have been the reason their empire collapsed. Not sure, but I suspect it had something to do with it.
