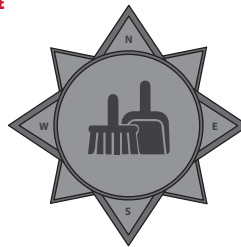


UNCLOG A TOILET

1. First and super important, if the toilet is not flushing right and there is excessive water inside it, don't flush it again. You don't want that puppy to overflow.

2. Break out a plunger. Use a high quality one. Place it over the hole at the bottom of the toilet. Vigorously plunge up and down about fifteen times. Remove the plunger (careful where it drips, that water is nasty), and observe. If the water level is down, you can try a flush. If not, repeat.

3. If this fails, and you know the problem is from organic waste, try using an enzyme toilet cleaner. This will liquefy fecal matter, but it will take several hours to start working. Carefully follow the instructions on the package or bottle.

4. Finally, if you start to think there may be a physical item in the toilet, like a toy or something, you will have to resort to fishing around with your hand. A rubber glove is a good companion to this task.
